Illness Guidance

Although feeling tired or unwell may prevent your child from wanting to come to school, if they can get out of bed and play or enjoy TV, they should be in school.

Looking after your child is important to us. We will contact you if we feel your child is not well enough to stay in school

There may be occasions where we request medical evidence when a child's absence is frequent or prolonged. This is to enable us to code the absence correctly and provide the support your child needs.

Your child can still attend school with colds, cold sores, eye infections and headlice. Please visit the NHS website 'Is my child too ill for school' for more advice or speak to our knowledgeable school staff

What Does the Law Say?

All children of compulsory school age must receive a suitable full-time education.

Once you have registered your child at a school, as a parent, you are legally responsible for ensuring that your child attends. Failure to do so is an offence under section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996. If a child is registered at a school, they must by law attend that school regularly and punctually.

Children should only miss school if they are ill or unable to attend for some other unavoidable reason.

Please help us promote good attendance throughout our school – you really do play an important role.

Legal Action

If your child is of compulsory school age, but absent without good reason, the school may choose not to authorise any of those days.

This could result in the council taking action against you for each child absent, including:

- A fine – currently £160 per parent per child (penalty notice)
 - Attendance Prosecution through the Magistrates' Courts which could lead to a fine of up to £2,500 or a parenting order being issued.
- So... get your child to school **EVERY** day and on time!

Arriving Late to School

Good attendance doesn't just involve being present in school – it also involves punctuality!

Minutes late per day	= days missed learning
5 minutes	3 days
10 minutes	7 days
15 minutes	10 days
20 minutes	14 days

Attendance Matters

Don't underestimate the importance of 100% attendance. Even one day missed can your child's learning! There are 190 school days, leaving 175 days FREE!

Attendance	= days Missed Learning!	What this means...
100%	0 Days	The very best chance of success!
98%	4 Days	Off to a flying start!
95%	10 Days	2 whole weeks missed
90%	19 Days	Missing important opportunities school can offer
